

IB MYP-DP Librarian

In addition to the traditional librarian responsibilities (cataloguing, providing a supporting role to the IB MYP and DP Programme for personal learning and projects, ensure books and resources are well organised and up to date, planning and deploying library based lessons, keep policies and procedures up to date, promote the library resources and reading by inviting authors, organising book weeks,)

ARIS librarian act as curators of information, caretakers of content and people, catalysts of people and services, and connectors to sources of information, multi literacies, and reading. ARIS Librarians' responsibilities are inspired by the learning environments students and staff engage with, and in that capacity, they are co-creators of information with the school and the wider community. They challenge learners to seek appropriate information, to use sound methods of inquiry and research, and teach them to question the information they find and use.

In short, the ARIS librarian is the person to know if the learner wants to learn how to access and work with information to generate and/or answer an inquiry question. ARIS librarian has to have the skills to locate and access information on whatever obscure topic DP students may have chosen for their EE (or IA). It's the librarian's job to be able to teach learner to understand how to journey from the vague stirrings of an interest in a topic all the way through to a carefully researched, tightly argued and appropriately sourced and referenced essay answering a thoughtfully worded inquiry question within the space of about nine months, reflecting during the process. In short, it is the librarian job to turn learners into an academic researcher or more specifically inquirer.

A degree in Library studies with 2 years' experience is needed. We are looking for someone who ideally has worked in a secondary IB setting and has experience of duties as a Librarian.
