Also, the PYP teacher should be able to provide professional expertise, high quality teaching and learning, make effective use of resources and ensure high standards of learning and achievement for all students.

He/She should:

- Design and develop a challenging and inquiry-based curriculum that aligns with educational standards and encourages student exploration.
- Integrate real-world applications and cross-disciplinary connections into lesson plans.
- Deliver interactive and student-centered lessons, utilizing a variety of teaching methods to accommodate diverse learning styles.
- Provide timely and constructive feedback to support student learning and improvement.
- Incorporate technology into lessons to enhance learning experiences.
